-A short written report addressing application ideas gained during the conference/course.

**GRADING / METHODS OF EVALUATION:**

Participation and written work should be done at the highest standard of quality and at the graduate level and needs to include the following:

A --- 100% attendance – during the time-frame illustrated in this syllabus; participation in small and large group discussions and sharing sessions; concise written report with one or more application ideas gained specifically at the conference.

AB --- 90% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

B --- 85% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

BC --- 80% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

C --- 75% of the above assignment, participation levels, etc.

If below a C is to be awarded, it means that participant did not attend the full conference and did not complete the written assignment on time and in a satisfactory manner.
